Community & Welfare News

Donations this month include -

- £7,500 to Oakleaf, mental illness charity working with local residents (see below).
- £200 for window blinds for vulnerable resident in ground floor flat, via SCC Support Worker.
- £350 support for autistic 15 year old to allow her mum a few hours respite a week, via SCC Targeted Youth Worker.
- £725 to Guildford & Godalming foodbanks.
- £500 contribution to Lions Clubs International Disaster Fund.

Sponsored Sleep Out for Guildford Action

About 50 people slept out for this initiative including the Mayor, Sallie Barker, who had to be woken before they started to clear up! The event was heavily supported by Guildford College with their CEO and Ops Director as well as about 20 others sleeping out. One of our members joined them, he reported that most people managed to get a few hours sleep and it remained dry and not too cold.

The event looks to have raised a much needed £9k that will contribute to maintaining their essential services. Problems with grants and reduced donations are affecting them.



An Update and Thank You from Oakleaf www.oakleaf-enterprise.org

As we approach the end of the year I write to update you on Oakleaf's work as well as to thank you and all the members of the Guildford Lions for your ongoing support! In these darker months Oakleaf is working hard to ensure help is available to all our clients. As you know while Christmas is often seen as a time of joy and connection for many of our clients it can be especially difficult. Hence, we're so grateful for your longstanding support which has helped keep Oakleaf's doors open. Thank you. Looking back at the last reporting year there are a number of achievements I want to share with you:

- We delivered over 2,000 counselling sessions to 200 people, with 86% of clients reporting significant improvements in their mental wellbeing.
- Our employment project saw 105 clients gain a certificate or qualification.

- 4,887 attendances in our wide-range wellbeing activities.
- Over 2,000 individuals accessed the Guildford Safe Haven, receiving critical crisis assistance.

In total Oakleaf supported 758 registered clients, providing crucial services that help people rebuild their lives and achieve their goals. As we look ahead to 2025, we face several ongoing challenges - continued rising costs, increasing demand for our services, and the consequences of reduced funding availability in the charity sector. It is a difficult environment to operate in, however our 27-year mission to support local people with their mental health is no less resolute. We're so grateful for your ongoing support."
